

Canadian Youth Long Track Championships Selection Bulletin

Revised March 9, 2022

PREAMBLE

The purpose of this Bulletin is to provide information concerning the format of the selection of Team Ontario for the 2022 Canadian Youth Long Track Championships (CYLTC).

The order of precedence for speed skating rules for events sanctioned by OSSA is:


- This Technical Bulletin (2019-2020 OSSA Long Track Technical Bulletin)
- SSC Rule Book
- ISU Rule Book

Participants, coaches, club officials and parents are reminded that a ruling by the chief referee at any event is final and is only subject to appeal in accordance with the OSSA Appeal Policy. OSSA's Code of Conduct applies in all dealings with meet competition officials.

In extenuating circumstances outside of competition, the OSSA Technical Committee has the final say.

EVENTS TO SELECT TEAM ONTARIO FOR CYLTC

The event has been cancelled due to weather and ice conditions.

SELECTION CRITERIA FOR TEAM ONTARIO FOR CYLTC

The format of the CYLTC is contained in the relevant SSC Competitions Bulletin which can be accessed at <u>https://speedskating.ca/?s=competitions+bulletin&post_type=resource</u>. Skaters and coaches should familiarize themselves with the CYLTC format.

This year, the quota number of skaters that the Ontario Speed Skating Association may send to CYLTC is 1 skater per age/gender. Additional spots may become available if other Branches decline their spots. Therefore, the provisional Team Ontario will include the 4 skaters per age class (one skater to fill Ontario's quota spot, plus three provisional alternates).

Priorities for Team Ontario Selection

Selection of age-eligible skaters to represent Team Ontario at the CYLTC will be made based upon the following Priorities in each age class:

1) Skaters that skated at the **Ontario Provincial Long Track Championships** will fill quota spots and alternate spots based on overall order of finish at the Championships.

2) Skaters that did not skate at the **Ontario Provincial Long Track Championships** but registered for the **Canadian Youth LT Championships Qualifying Event** (cancelled) will fill the next available quota or alternate spots based on their long track times skated since August 1, 2021 at an SSC sanctioned event. The process for ranking the submitted times is described in the section below.

3) Skaters that did not skate at the **Ontario Provincial Long Track Championships** but registered for the **Canadian Youth LT Championships Qualifying Event** (cancelled) and have no long track times from an SSC sanctioned event since August 1, 2021 will fill the next available spots.

4) Other skaters that submit times skated since August 1, 2021 at an SSC sanctioned event will fill the next available spots.

Ranking Submitted Times (for Priority 2 listed above)

Skaters that did not compete at the **Ontario Provincial Long Track Championships** must submit their long track times skated since August 1, 2021 at an SSC Sanctioned event to OSSA by emailing <u>sportmanager@ontariospeedskating.ca</u> by **Sunday March 20, 2022 at 11:59pm**. The following process will be followed to rank the skaters based on their submitted long track times.

Within a given age class, skaters' best times in each Qualification Distance (500m and 1500m Olympic Style) will be ranked from fastest to slowest and assigned racing points as outlined in Appendix A.

For example, within each age class, the fastest time in the 1500m will be assigned 1000 points, the second fastest time in the 1500m will be assigned 816 points, the third fastest time in the 1500m will be assigned 666 points and so on. This same process will occur for the 500m.

The sum of each skater's racing points from the two Qualification Distances will be used to rank skaters in each age class from most points to least points. In each age class, the skater with the most points based on the ranking process described in Priority 2 will fill the first available spot (quota or alternate) on Team Ontario, the skater with the next most points will fill the next available spot on Team Ontario and so on.

To ensure consistency when selecting the team, all times will be converted to outdoor times using the common conversion factor of 106% of the indoor time.

Tie-Breaker

In the event of a tie in the sum of each skater's total points from the two Qualification Distances, the skater with the fastest long track combined 500m +1500m time will break the tie.

Timeline

Sunday March 20 at 11:59pm	Skaters who raced at Ontario Provincial Long Track Championships must confirm intent to participate at Canadian Youth Long Track Championships.			
	Skaters who wish to be considered for Team Ontario based on long track times skated since August 1, 2021 at an SSC sanctioned event must submit their accurate seed times, including the exact decimal places, the location and exact date skated.			
	Skaters who wish to be considered for Team Ontario who do not have long track times skated since August 1, 2021 at an SSC sanctioned event must submit their name to be considered for team selection.			
	All skaters submitting information must email <u>sportmanager@ontariospeedskating.ca</u> and include their name, club, birthdate, SSC# and age as of July 1, 2021, in addition to their long track times if applicable.			
Week of March 28, 2022	OSSA will release the provisional team consisting of 1 primary skater and up to 3 alternates per eligible age class to represent Ontario at the CYLTC.			
Week of April 4, 2022	Once the number of spots has been confirmed in each age class by SSC, OSSA will release the list of skaters confirmed to attend the CYLTC in Quebec City.			

The OSSA Technical Committee has the final say in selection of Team Ontario for the CYLTC.

SEED TIMES FOR CYLTC

Seed times are required by Speed Skating Canada for entry to the CYLTC. Seed times may be from indoor or outdoor competitions. The seed times required for CYLTC are:

- 500m Olympic Style (all categories)
- 1500m Olympic Style (Girls 13, 14 and Boys 14, 15)
- 300m Mass Start (all categories)

If a skater qualifies for CYLTC and does not have seed times in any distance, the skater will be seeded at the bottom of the group.
